

Preparatory Workshop for Hawaii Cultural Study Tour

A preparatory workshop was held for the third batch of participants to gain a better picture of Hawaii culture, by understanding the reasons of establishment for the Polynesian Cultural Centre (PCC), the diverse cultures in Hawaii and the key learning points from various communities. Chuang Chiao-yun from the previous batch emphasized that connection, trust and co-sharing responsibility are crucial values. The team split into smaller groups to discuss topics such as tourism, marketing design, indigenous education and land conservation, elaborating on observations from their respective communities. The discussion involved brainstorming for solutions, setting the direction for the team's learning and effective teamwork.

Themes included artificial intelligence, transitional justice, belonging, to name a few. 77 eighth-graders of the Ci-xin Waldorf School presented their special reports over six days beginning 6 June, showcasing artistic works inspired by family relations to self-reflections. Luodong High's Teacher Chen Boru brought her students from the mainstream system to be exposed to such reports which they can explore too. Eleven batches of Ci-xin students have benefitted from the experience. A student started learning the Minnan language to communicate with his grandmother. A student with Down Syndrome sang the Moana theme song on stage, hoping that she can be as courageous as the female lead, touching teachers and parents in the audience.
